- PID 5-Gas meter is in and in the orange case on S20 for now. Same 4 gases as other meters with the 5th being a PID to measure VOCs, Volatile Organic Compounds in PPM. Never let it suck liquids. Use the particulate filter if it's a dusty atmosphere. Air pump pulls 3sec/foot. 10' of hose in the case takes 30sec for readings to stabilize. Charging is the same cord as the 4-gas meters.

- Moth repellents and air fresheners.

- Hydrogen Peroxide.
